The recipient shall possess sincere respect for their fellow students, as well as, a "concern for critters".

In 300-500 words, write an essay discussing an obstacle or adversity that you faced and how you overcame it. What did you learn from the experience?






John B. & Margaret A. Hogan Medical Scholarship

This scholarship provides a merit-based scholarship for a graduate pursuing a college degree in an area of study related to health care. The scholarship recipient will have attended St. Philip Catholic Central High School throughout high school, have a distinguished academic record to an aggregate "B" average, active involvement in community service and campus ministry, and demonstrated leadership ability.

Mr. and Mrs. List were active parishioners at St. Philip Parish and loyal supporters for the work of the BCACS Foundation.

Originally from Chicago, Illinois, Mr. and Mrs. List located to Battle Creek in 1939 when Mr. List joined the Kellogg Company. He was a senior vice president at the time of his retirement in 1975. Mr. List passed away in 1996 and Mrs. List passed away in 2017. Their daughter, Elizabeth M. List passed away in 1992.

This scholarship recognizes a St. Philip graduate for their academic achievements; community related service and active participation in school related organizations and athletics.

Mary Ann Cole's family is offering the **Mary Ann Cole Kindness Memorial Scholarship** as a tribute to a woman who demonstrated her strong faith by the way she treated others. The scholarship recipient will have demonstrated kindness to his or her fellow students, friends, family, teachers, and school administrators.

St. Philip Internship Scholarship

The **St. Philip Internship Scholarship** was established with part of a grant from the Calhoun County Intermediate School District which promotes college and career readiness. This scholarship is for St. Philip students who participate in the St. Philip Internship program. Scoring will be based on 3 components: 1) Internship Evaluation (feedback from employer 2) Essay turned in with BCACS Foundation scholarship application 3) Formal internship presentation to the school and community.

In 700-1500 words, write an essay discussing how the St. Philip Internship Program has changed you, your perspective, your understanding of your faith, and/or your plans for the future.



Applications should be submitted online at www.bcacs.org no later than 11:59pm on Friday, April 14, 2023.

Please complete the online application including essays, attaching a copy of your transcript and ACT/SAT scores along with any other requirements.

Please read the following tips and tools before submitting your scholarship applications:

- 1. Read the application overview packet (attached) thoroughly to make sure that you are eligible to apply.
- 2. Make sure that you have all of the required documents attached.
- 3. Read each essay question carefully and make sure that your response is answering the question(s).
- 4. Review, review, review. There are plenty of staff that are happy to edit your application essays to make sure they are free of errors. Remember, many of our review committee members scoring your applications do not know you personally and are grading your essays based solely on what you write. Multiple errors will indicate that you did not take your time to review your responses.
